OVERVIEW

The primary focus of the Yellow Rose Junior Cotillion is to prepare children to thrive in any setting; reach their ultimate personal, social and leadership potential in society; emerge as leaders among their peers and to make friends along the way.

The season is filled with exciting events, including social activities, etiquette workshops, social dance lessons, and the opportunity to become good friends with outstanding students from other Dallas-area schools.

We meet on the second Sunday of each month at Gleneagles Country Club, (2 pm – 3:15 for 4th through 6th graders and 3:30 pm to 5 pm. For 7th through 8th graders), unless communicated otherwise for special events.

The season culminates with our Grand Ball. This ball is a formal event that includes dinner, presentation of the students and dancing. Held annually in the spring, the ball for this class will be April 10, 2022.

Activities & Events

The Cotillion fee is \$595. This fee includes all workshops, workbooks, class materials, monthly refreshments and two Souvenir Program portrait pages.

In addition to regular meetings and etiquette workshops, there are **6** key events during the Season. All activities are priced at cost. They are:

To protect your children, we adhere strongly to COVID protocols. The Country Club sanitizes the room immediately before our arrival and covers the tables with freshly laundered cloths.

Until further notice, we are asking all students and parents to wear masks during class session. Please note that due to social distancing, we cannot allow parents to remain in the room during our session, unless they are serving as official chaperones/volunteers.

OPERATIONS

As with most cotillions, we rely on our parents to assist as members of the **Parents' Board**. In this role, volunteers will assist with registration, serve as chaperones, and/or serve on the ball committee. This enables us to keep our fees down for classes and for the ball.

In order for us to manage classes efficiently, please ensure that your child does the following:

1. Calls if he or she will be absent (the call should not come from you).
2. Arrives five minutes early prior to class to wait in lobby and participate in receiving line at the beginning of class
3. Arrives to each session in proper cotillion attire
4. Brings his/her workbook to every class
5. Listens, and not talk, when the director is speaking
6. Shows respect for fellow cotillion students and the property
7. Never refuses a dance
8. Ends each session with a "thank you"

9. Practices the suggested skills at home, with friends, family and neighbors each month. Prizes will be given for the most recorded practices
10. Understands if books are lost, replacement books are \$25.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

ALL Cotillion Members

Responsibilities include:

1. Arriving at the Country Club five minutes before class to gather in lobby and participate in monthly receiving line upon entering class
2. Participating fully in all classes and completing homework
3. Calling Mrs. Layeni (student, not the parent), if they will be late or absent
4. Purchasing or acquiring a Dress/Ball Gown/Tuxedo by February 1.
5. Arranging for presentation by parents
6. Attending a minimum of 90 percent of all workshops/activities
7. Learning all dances taught through the Cotillion
8. Being fully engaged; dancing at least 90 percent of the dances at the balls
9. Writing and presenting a personal mission statement
10. Wearing appropriate attire for class and parties
11. Optional: Personal tea/party – Parents may allow their children to use their new-found hosting skills to invite members to a social event (tea, pool party, etc.). For planning purposes, please notify the Cotillion if this is your wish.

Specific Commitments: Parents

1. Parents are required to purchase a minimum of 2 ball tickets
2. Parents are asked to secure at least two ad pages.
3. Participate in photo session with your child on the day of the Ball
4. Help students set up "Brag Tables."
5. Participate in a mandatory waltz/bow workshop and rehearsal to be held in March.

YELLOW ROSE GRAND BALL ATTIRE REQUIREMENTS

4th – 6th Grade Girls

- Tea length dress with full skirt and petticoat (no straight, A-line or princess cut gowns)
- Gloves – Wrist length
- Flesh-colored hose
- Shoes – White. Flat. No sandals or sling backs.

- Hair – Must be worn in a soft, appropriate style without any visible hair ornaments (hair combs, banana clips, ponytail holders, etc.).
- Jewelry – The only jewelry permitted is a single strand of pearls with simple pearl earrings.

7th – 8th Grade Girls

- Gowns -- must be a WHITE floor-length BALL GOWN with a petticoat (no straight, a-line or princess cut gowns). No strapless dresses or long sleeves. The Gown should provide for adequate frontal coverage, have a full skirt to allow for a graceful bow, and not be over-embellished (beads, pearls, sequins, etc.). Dresses must be pre-registered with the Cotillion Chairman prior to purchase. Dresses must be purchased by **Feb. 1, 2022**
- Gloves – Opera length (above the elbow)
- Shoes – White. Flat or with heels no taller than 1/2 inch. No sandals or sling backs.
- Hair – Must be worn in a soft, appropriate style without any visible hair ornaments (hair combs, banana clips, ponytail holders, etc.).
- Jewelry – The only jewelry permitted is a single strand of pearls with simple pearl earrings.
- Makeup – Tinted lip gloss is appropriate for girls at this age (for photo sessions).

Boys

- Boys will wear a tuxedo and white gloves, which will be specified by the Cotillion.

Parents and Guests

- The mother of the junior debutante will wear a long formal of any style or color, except white. Mothers are expected to come dressed the day of the affair. Fathers will wear tuxes or dark suits and are to come dressed the day of the affair.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

Junior Belle and Belle of the Ball. This is the highest award given to girls. The winner is named and presented on the evening of the ball. The Honoree receives a monetary scholarship (10 percent of sales), sash, tiara, bouquet, two-page spread congratulatory ad in the journal, framed certificate and a ceremonial walk across the dance floor. She is also featured in a press release submitted to area media.

Junior Beau and Beau of the Ball. This is the highest award given to boys. The winner is named and presented on the evening of the ball. The Honoree receives a monetary scholarship (10 percent of sales), crown, two-page spread congratulatory ad in the journal, framed certificate and a ceremonial walk across the dance floor. He is also featured in a press release submitted to area media.

CRITERIA

- The student whose accumulated point value is the highest will be crowned. Points will be given based on the following:
 - Overall participation in scheduled events: i.e. attendance, participation level in etiquette sessions, attire adherence during class and events, attendance at events, participation in dance sessions, portrait session, and other scheduled events
 - Timely submission of documentation and financial obligations. I.e. items submitted by deadlines, tracking report of attendance

- **The Achievers Award.** Participants will be evaluated on academic average, community involvement and a written essay. Both will be presented with a framed certificate and sash.
- **Mr. and Miss Congeniality.** This award is presented to the boy and girl with the most peer votes. They are considered the best-mannered, most friendly, kind, helpful and genuine. Both will be presented with a framed certificate and sash.
- **The Good Samaritan Award.** This award is presented to the boy and girl who have made a difference in the community through voluntarism. Winners will be selected from those who can provide evidence of volunteer hours with a sealed, signed letter from organizations, along with letters of recommendation from organizations served by the students. Both will be presented with a framed certificate and sash.
- **Best Dressed Table.** This award honors the participant who has best shared his/her life story and interests in a way that best and most creatively reflects the theme of the current year. The brag table winner receives a monetary award of \$50 and a framed certificate.

SOUVENIR PROGRAM

The Souvenir Journal is a pictorial history of the Cotillion experience and compilation of congratulatory ads for each cotillion member. The ads are for expressions of love, congratulations and friendship from family, friends, business and professional associates.

This keepsake is the primary annual fundraiser that pays for the ball and plants seed money into the program. Proceeds derived from ad sales are earmarked for ball preparations, awards to participants, scholarships for underserved children and program development. Each year, the Cotillion will name a **Belle and Beau** of the ball. This award is calculated on a weighted scale, factoring in ad sales and participation points over the season.

Publishing requires long hours of work and concentration. Your cooperation in meeting all the highlighted deadlines is appreciated.

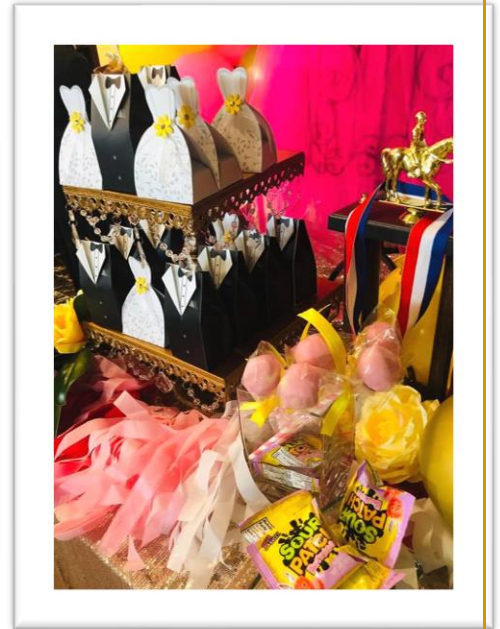

Brag Table Guidelines

Brag Tables are a great way for our children to see how much they have already accomplished in life, while celebrating what lies ahead for them! Photos, awards, scrapbooks, decorations, vision boards, favorite things (a football, a miniature replica of the Eiffel Tower, award-winning science project, etc.) should tell us about their lives, accomplishments, interests and dreams for the future)



The **Best Dressed Table Award** honors the student who has shared his/her life story and interests in a way that best and most creatively reflects a self-given theme through her brag table.

Following are guidelines.

- Tables should capture the beauty and essence of each student.
- Extra points will be given for creativity and decor.
- All scrapbook/brag tables need to be up and ready for viewing no later than **noon** the day of the ball,
- Students will be assigned brag tables based on the order in which they are being presented. Names will be placed on the table by logistics before they arrive.
- The table is 3'-0" long, 18" deep, and 30" high.
- The tables will be draped with white cloth. Students may change out, however.
- Some tables are against the wall and some tables are not.
- Boards, frames, materials, etc. can stand alone.
- No gluing to the tablecloth, or taping to the wall will be allowed
- Boards and tall displays may be used. You may have items that drape over the table to the floor.
- Boxes will be stored under the table.
- The brag table will be judged by guests, using a scoring sheet.
- Winners will be announced during the ball. A first, second and third place certificate will be given
- The first-place winner will receive a monetary award of \$50. Second and third-place winners will receive a certificate.

ADS and PATRONS

Each student is asked to collect a minimum of \$500 in ads, donations, or sponsorship. This fundraising approach relieves parents of the obligation to self-fund what could be an expensive season, to fund the ball, present awards and help build self-initiative and personal responsibility in participants.
